

Te Whakakitenga o Waikato Incorporated (“we” or “us”)

PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

In collaboration with our partners, we have established partnership scholarships as part of our ongoing relationships to achieve Whakatupuranga 2050. Partnership Scholarships have a core objective, - to support and promote ongoing educational opportunities to suitable Waikato-Tainui tribal members, with a focus on priority pathways. The following partnership scholarships are available:

- The **Department of Conservation Scholarship** is available to tribal members who are enrolled in degree or postgraduate study in Conservation, Environment, Marine, Heritage Planning and/or Archaeology.
- The **Waikato District Council Waikato River Scholarship** is available to tribal members who are enrolled in degree or post-graduate qualifications majoring in Planning, Resource Management, Environmental Science and/or Engineering who can demonstrate their study's alignment to the restoration and wellbeing of the Waikato River.
- The **Waikato-Tainui and NZTA Kaapua Ngaa Kaakaho Scholarship** is available to tribal members who are enrolled in undergraduate or postgraduate study in Planning, Engineering, Surveying, Environmental Science, Ecology and/or Archaeology.
- The **Waikato-Tainui and NZTA Heritage Protection Grant** is available to tribal members completing tertiary study in archaeology at the University of Auckland or the University of Otago.
- The **Tainui Group Holdings Harbour Asset Management Grant** is available to tribal members completing an Accounting, Finance and/or Economics undergraduate degree who can demonstrate their understanding of long-term intergenerational investments for iwi.
- The **Simpson Grierson Scholarship & Internship** is available to undergraduate law students studying at the University of Waikato who can demonstrate their understanding of the importance of governance, asset management and/or public policy for iwi.
- The **NIWA Masters Scholarship** is intended to support a student completing a Masters research project on Maatauranga Maaori relevant to developing treatment of agricultural drainage water using wood-chip bioreactors or filamentous algae nutrient scrubbers, and potential benefits to mahinga kai in downstream drainage ditches. Successful applicants would have an interest in Maatauranga Maaori related to environmental restoration, a commitment to contributing to tribal environmental initiatives and experience in freshwater ecology and mahinga kai.

Criteria and eligibility is as follows:

- Applications will only be considered from Waikato-Tainui registered tribal members.
- Partnership scholarships have an application closing date of 30 June 2019.
- Applications must be completed in full and include confirmation of current enrolment, and verification of bank details if not already completed as part of an application within the 2019 Tertiary Grants round.
- Decisions about application outcomes are final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- Successful applicants may be asked to participate in Waikato-Tainui tribal events or promotional activities. Successful applicants may also be asked to participate in events or promotional activities with the Waikato-Tainui scholarship partner.



- Applicants can apply for consecutive scholarships by producing evidence of previous years' academic results and must meet all other eligibility requirements.
- Information about applicants will be made available to scholarship partners, and as a result, applicants may be invited by the scholarship partners to take part in initiatives such as internships, placements and/or work experience.
- Sole discretion as to whether we accept or decline an application rests with us.

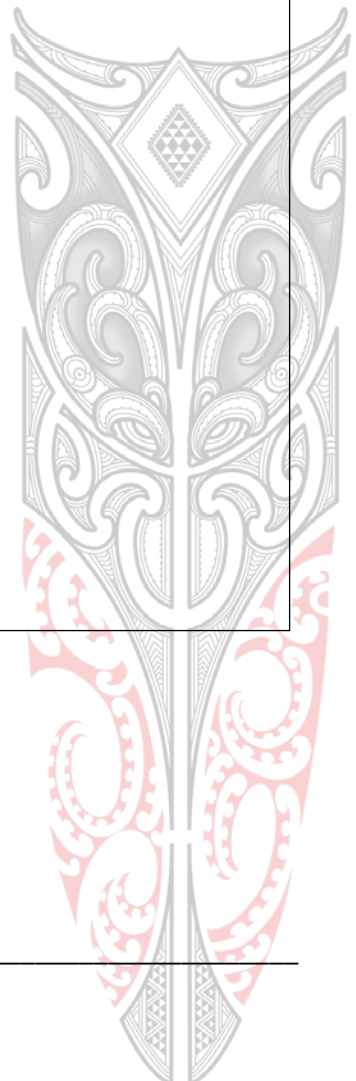
